## Local Health Officers Urge Bay Area Families to Prioritize Immunizations in Back-to-School Preparations

**Alameda County, CA** — As children and families across the Bay Area prepare for the upcoming school year, Bay Area health officials urge everyone to make sure your back-to-school checklist starts with getting your child vaccinated.

Vaccines are safe, effective, and a routine part of preventative health care. They protect against serious diseases such as measles, pertussis (also known as whooping cough), and polio. Health officials in Alameda County are reminding residents to get their children vaccinated and vaccine resources are available.

"Back-to-school is the perfect time to catch up on your children's recommended vaccines," said Dr. Nicholas Moss, Alameda County Health Officer. "Vaccines are a safe, effective and simple tool for protecting our kids from serious illness."

Children in California are required to receive certain immunizations to attend public and private elementary and secondary schools, childcare centers, family day care homes, nursery schools, day nurseries, and developmental centers (pre-kindergarten facilities). Families are encouraged to:

- Check their child's vaccination records with their health care provider or through California's Digital Vaccine Record portal.
- Schedule well-child visits early and before the school year begins to avoid lastminute delays.
- Access low- or no-cost vaccinations through local public health clinics if uninsured or underinsured.
