










Disparities in Cases & Deaths













Counts and Capacity Over Time Mobile version






California's Blueprint for a Safer Economy

- On August 28th, the State replaced the County Monitoring List framework with a color-coded fourtier **Blueprint for a Safer Economy**
- The Blueprint **revises criteria** for loosening and tightening restrictions on activities
- The new indicators capture disease burden and testing
 - If metrics fall across tiers, county placed in the most restrictive tier
- A third **health equity** measure is pending


County risk level	New cases	Positive tests
WIDESPREAD Many non-essential indoor business operations are closed	More than 7 daily new cases (per 100k)	More than 8% Positive tests
SUBSTANTIAL Some non-essential indoor business operations are closed	4 - 7 daily new cases (per 100k)	5 - 8% Positive tests
MODERATE Some indoor business operations are open with modifications	1 - 3.9 daily new cases (per 100k)	2 - 4.9% Positive tests
MINIMAL Most indoor business operations are open with modifications	Less than 1 daily new cases (per 100k)	Less than 2% Positive tests





County Tier Status


- Alameda County moved into the Red **Tier today**, indicating substantial risk
- CDPH assesses county indicators weekly
- A county will remain in a tier for **a minimum of three weeks** before being able to advance to a later tier
- A county can **only move forward one** tier at a time, even if metrics qualify for a more advanced tier

Alameda County COVID-19 Daily Case Rate, 2020



Impact on Activities and Businesses

- The Blueprint alters reopening plans for some businesses and activities opening some that had been prohibited and imposing new standards on others
- For example, counties in the Red tier may open:
 - Indoor museums with restrictions and at 25% maximum capacity
 - Indoor personal care services with restrictions
 - Indoor retail and malls at 50% maximum capacity
- Local Health Jurisdictions can be more restrictive than the State





Alameda County Shelter in Place Order

- At this time, there is **no change to permitted or prohibited activities** in Alameda County
- We are using the **next two weeks to ensure our metrics remain stable**
- We will release a phased plan that balances increased risk of spread of COVID-19 from newly permitted activities alongside appropriate mitigation strategies
- Bringing students back for in-person learning is a top priority for the next phase of reopening





Alameda County Schools Update

- Counties may open in-person learning after a minimum of two weeks in the Red Tier; Alameda County will resume in-person learning in phases
- We are currently reviewing **elementary school waiver requests** from schools and districts for early return to in-person school learning, per State guidance
- For all in-person learning, schools and districts will need **reopening plans** that address disinfection, cohorting, health screenings, contact tracing, and testing
- Districts are encouraged to utilize the State's guidance for Small Cohorts/Groups of Children and Youth to serve highest needs students





Additional Updates

- Expansion of testing, case investigation, contact tracing, outreach and education, with a particular focus in neighborhoods with highest health disparities
- Flu vaccine planning underway
- COVID vaccine planning beginning
