




Epidemic Data Key Points

- Daily case rate is 20.3 per 100,000
 - Averaging 300 reported cases per day
- Case rate 3x higher in unvaccinated compared with vaccinated residents
- Test positivity is 5.9 %
 - HPI first quartile: 8.9 %
- Hospitalized COVID cases 201 (212 max); ICU 49
- Testing ~7,500 per day
- Self-reported mask use increased from 65% on 7/11 to 83% on 8/8*





New Alameda County COVID-19 Cases by episode date





Alameda County COVID-19 weekly case rates









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Weekly Case Rates by Age, Alameda County, 5/31-8/1/2021
















Homeless IQ Hotel Response

- Re-opened Inn by the Coliseum 34 room site for IQ







Two New State Health Officer Orders issued August 5



The <u>first order</u> requires **workers** in health care settings to be **fully vaccinated** or receive their second dose by September 30, 2021.



The <u>second public health order</u> directs hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, and intermediate care facilities to verify that **visitors** are **fully vaccinated or** have **tested negative** for COVID-19 in the prior 72 hours before indoor visits.





Update on "Booster" Shots

- FDA may authorize and CDC may recommend additional vaccine for some
 - Expected first for immunocompromising conditions no details yet
 - For now, additional doses are not recommended
 - Other countries have also approved additional vaccine for older adults
- WHO urging prioritization of unvaccinated populations over boosters
- ACPHD/HCSA preparing to support any forthcoming recommendations
 - Public and provider engagement regular health system may have large role
 - May require deployment of county vaccination resources
- All US vaccines already proving highly protective against severe disease
 - New CDC data published Friday and Delta wave experience to date support this





D.O.O.R. Goals / Response Update

- The goal is to attempt 90,000 conversations in 8 weeks this week marks the start of week 4
- In addition to one-on-one support, we hold alternating bi-weekly DOOR Coordination and Learning Circle meetings, plus weekly newsletters with updated resources
- Door-knocking is 1 of 4 modalities we're utilizing during this time, other forms of outreach include popup events, canvassing commercial corridor, and mobile clinics

Village Connect's DOOR Knock Team (Cherryland/Ashland)

Countywide as of 8/9/21

- > 8,282 attempts
- > 2,736 conversations
- > **1,706** said yes

Vaccination rate (% of 12+pop w/ at least one dose)

- Total = 65% \geq
- AA/Black = 37% \succ

Estimated # of residents who are unvaccinated:

- \succ ≈ 1,400 Total
- ≈ 1,000-1,100 AA/Black \geq
- Number of Door-Knock Attempts: \geq 4540
- Number Reached/Conversations: \geq 1475
- \succ Said yes: 374

Additionally, Serenity House hosted a mobile vaccine pop-up:

43 West Oakland residents \geq vaccinated, mostly unhoused African-Americans




Testing Demand Continues to Increase

Community Testing Sites County wide report 3-5 times the testing demand as 2 weeks ago, with percent positives rising in our priority neighborhoods.











Contingencies

- Testing Division is working with testing sites and state resources to monitor testing demand and capacity.
- Current eligible options if demand surpasses testing capacity:
 - Redeploy current mobile testing options to other locations
 - Utilize State Optum Serve testing buses at different locations
 - Request greater resources from the State
 - Other options under consideration




