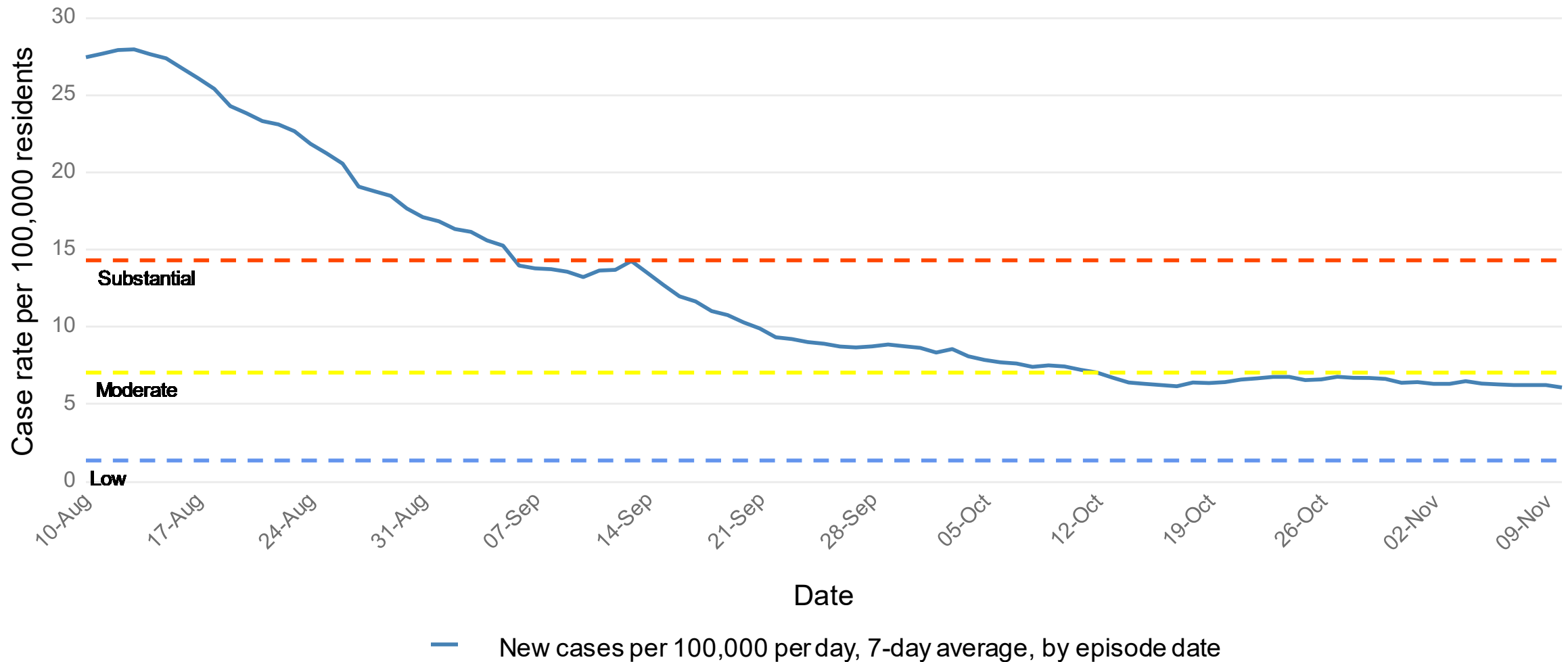

Epidemic Data Key Points

- Daily case rate is 6 per 100,000
- Test positivity is 1.3 %
- Hospitalized COVID cases 43; ICU 11
- ~11,000 lab tests per day
- Case rates remain flat
- Hospitalizations continue to decline

Alameda County COVID-19 Daily Case Rate



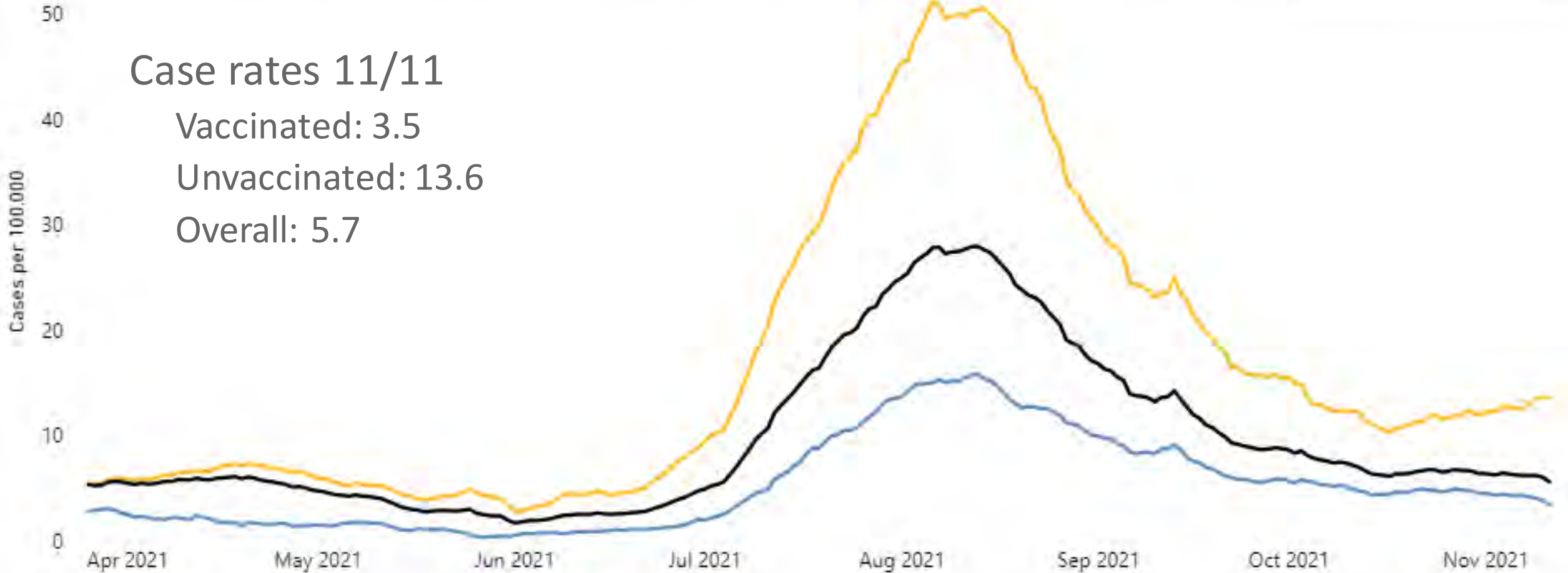

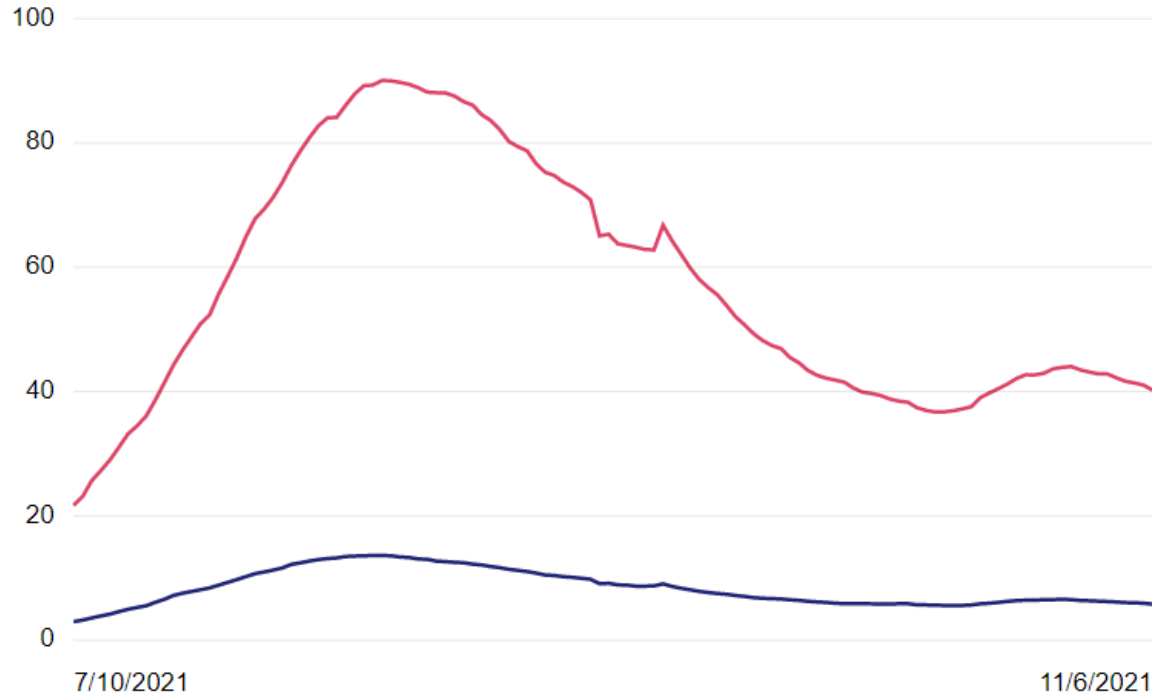

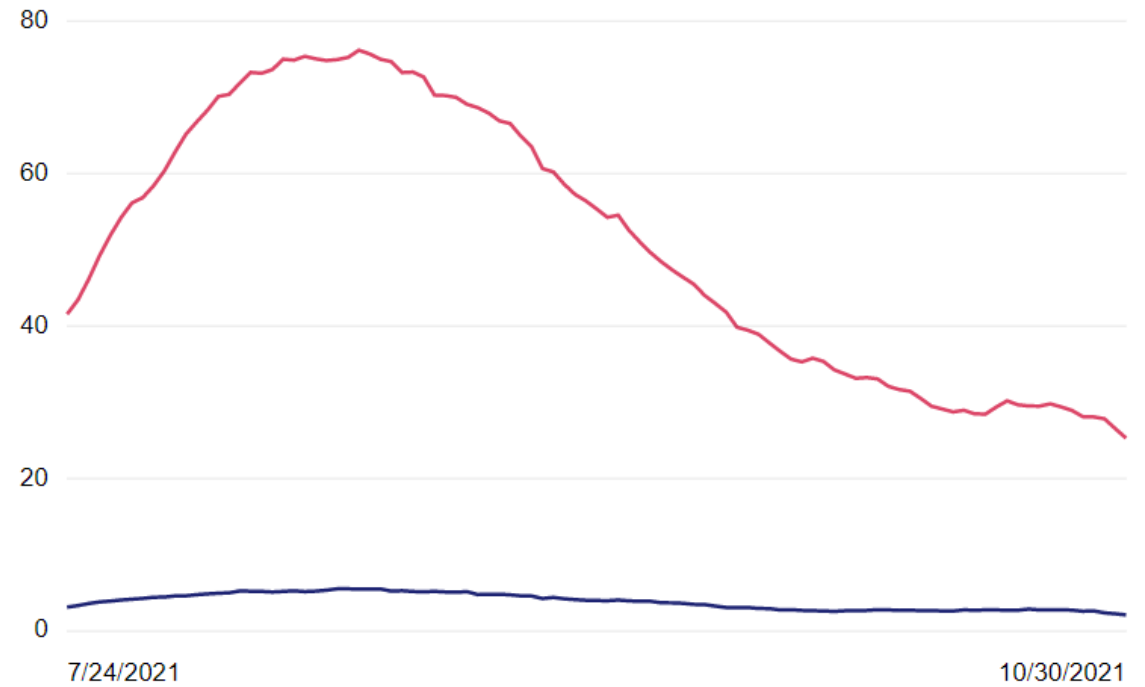
Statewide COVID-19 Cases and Hospitalizations by Vaccination Status

In CDC community transmission level moderate or low tier for at least 21 days	Current: Moderate for 7 days 	
<=3.30% 7-day average of hospital beds for COVID patients	1.75%	
80.00% of full population fully immunized (including 14 days for full immunization) - or - 8 weeks after authorization for COVID-19 vaccine of 5-11 year-olds (beginning on November 2)	74.27% -or- December 28

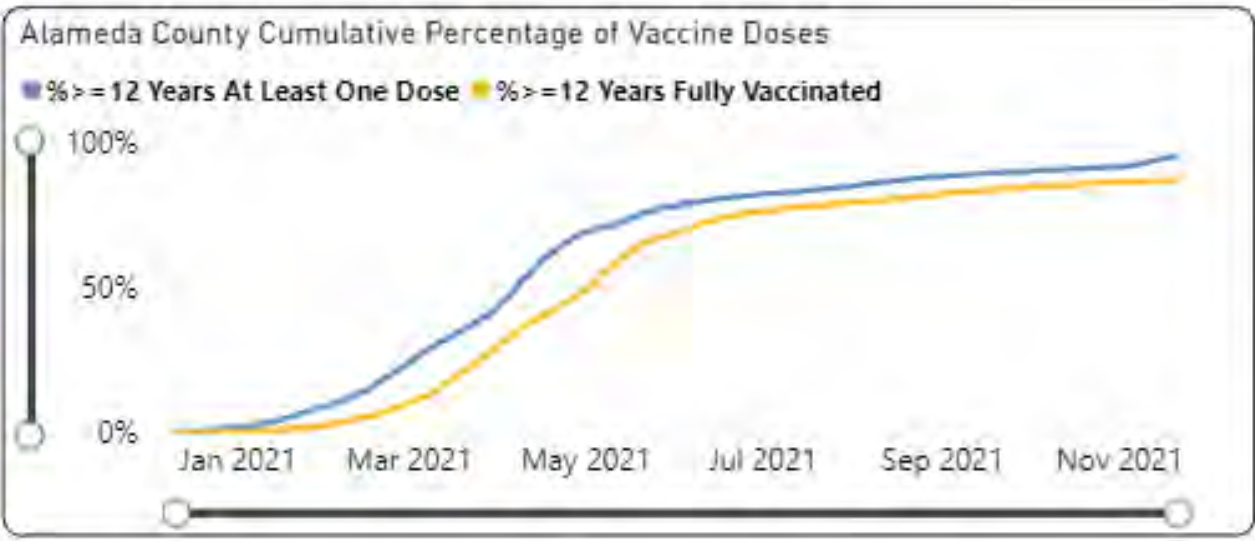

When?

At least 2 months after a 1-dose vaccine, Johnson&Johnson/ Janssen

or

At least 6 months after a 2-dose vaccine, Pfizer-BioNTech or Moderna

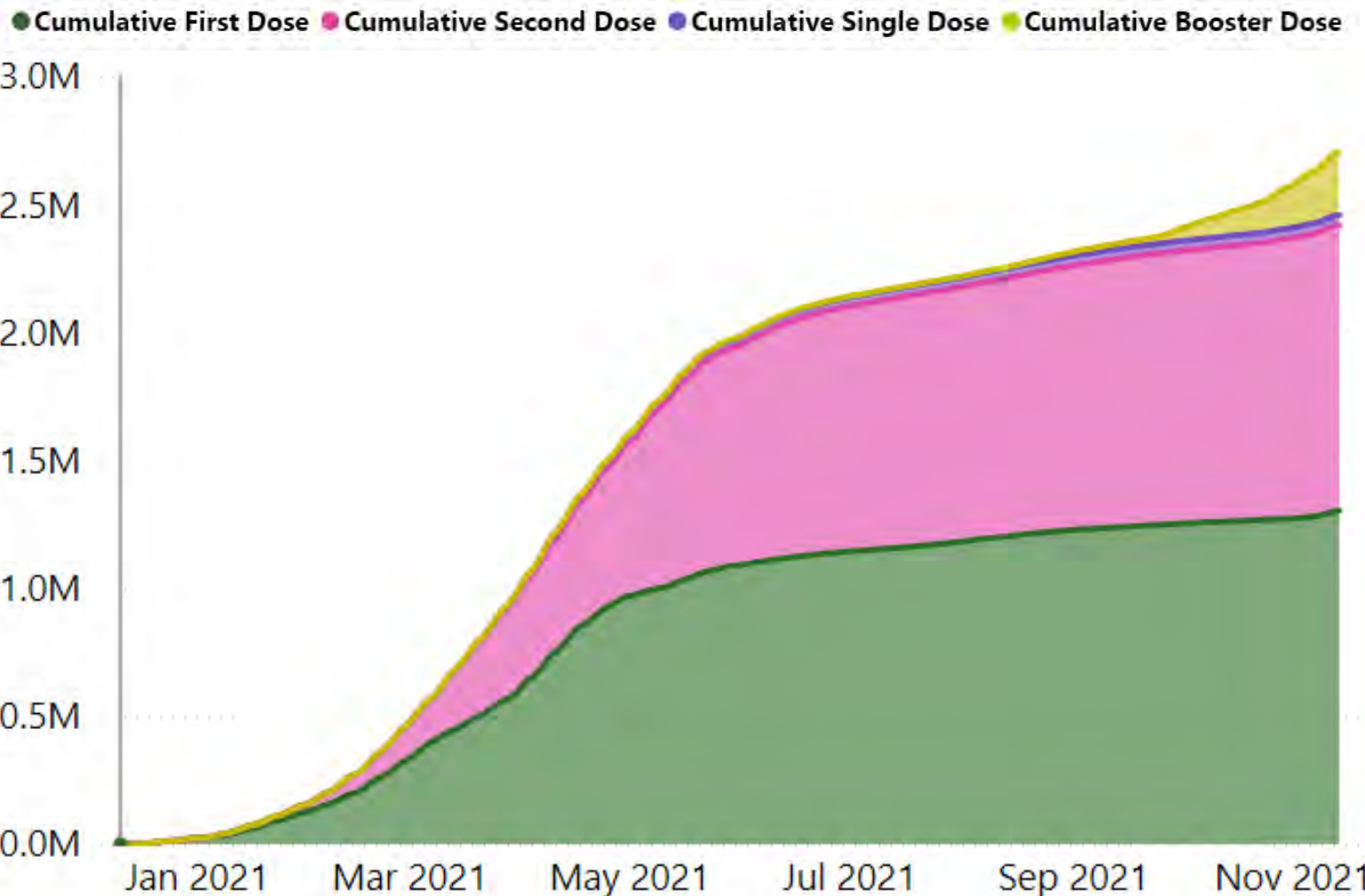

COVID-19 boosters now recommended for everyone 18 and up

- CDC, CDPH and Alameda County recommending boosters for all adults
 - You must be 6 months out from Pfizer/Moderna or 2 months out from J&J
- Why now?
 - Evidence of waning vaccine effectiveness against infection
 - Older adults at greatest risk of severe disease despite vaccination
 - Boosters are safe and improve protection
 - Winter surge has begun in the US
- Contact your health care provider or neighborhood pharmacy for boosters
 - You can also sign up through CA's My Turn, <https://myturn.ca.gov/>

Booster Doses Data 11/20



- 282,017 doses given
 - 23% of all fully vaccinated
 - 52% of those 65+
 - 27% of those 50-64

Community Vaccinations

11.15 – 11.21

- 1017 vaccine doses dispensed at 10 ACPHD led PODs last week (271 previous week at 4 PODs)
 - 572 doses at 5 OUSD Schools
 - 427 doses at 4 stationary POD sites
 - 18 doses at SSA Fremont Site
 - 650 pediatric Pfizer doses dispensed
 - Moderna (16 third dose, 0 booster)
 - Pfizer (16 third dose, 173 booster)
 - J&J (20 booster)
 - 193 Total Boosters



Communications

Make Plans for a Healthy Holiday Season



- **Get vaccinated**, including a booster if eligible
- **Stay home if you are sick**
- **Get tested** before & after travel or gathering
- If gathering with unvaccinated people, keep gatherings small, short, and outdoors
- **Wear a mask** when gathering indoors
- Don't forget your flu shot
