As we approach Election Day on November 8, we encourage Alameda County voters to exercise their rights. Mid-term election results have a profound impact on local, state and national issues. All registered voters in Alameda County should have received a Vote by Mail ballot. <u>Sign up to track your ballot</u> or <u>log into your voter profile</u>.

#### How to Vote:

- Through the mail, or by dropping off a Vote by Mail Ballot in a <u>24-Hour Drop</u> <u>Box.</u> Vote-by-mail ballots that are mailed must be postmarked on or before Election Day and received by the Registrar of Voters office no later than 7 days after Election Day.
- At any <u>Vote Center location</u>, 9:00 a.m. 5:00 p.m., in Alameda County starting October 29. Election Day hours are 7:00 a.m. 8:00 p.m.

If a ballot didn't arrive, call the Registrar of Voters' Office at (510) 272-6973. <u>More</u> <u>frequently asked questions</u>

# **Halloween Tips**

The fall season is officially here – a time for gathering just when we expect an increase in <u>COVID-19</u> cases and <u>flu</u> <u>season</u>. Don't miss out on your favorite seasonal activities. Use the layers of safety precautions we know work: get your updated COVID-19 booster (if eligible) and flu vaccine; wear a highquality mask; wash your hands often; stay home if you are sick; and know what treatments are available to you. Flu vaccine and COVID-19 boosters can be safely given at the same time.

Let's make sure <u>trick-or-treaters stay</u> <u>safe</u>, too:

- Use reflective tape on costumes and bags.
- Use crosswalks and corners to safely cross the street.
- Avoid using electronic devices.
- Walk, don't run!
- Before consumption, adults should inspect candy for tampering.

#### **New Crisis Residential Beds Project**



A new crisis residential beds project expands mental health and substance use disorder services in Central and Southern Alameda County. The California Department of Health Care Services recently awarded Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services \$18 million to expand coverage of severe mental health illness or substance abuse services and housing options in

underserved regions of the county. In partnership with local community-based organizations, including <u>La Familia</u>, <u>Telecare Corporation</u>, and <u>Seneca Family of</u> <u>Agencies</u>, the project will add 69 beds in East Oakland and South Hayward communities. ### Novavax Authorized as a COVID-19 Booster

Novavax is now authorized as a monovalent booster (not targeted to Omicron variant) for adults 18 years and older who have not previously received an mRNA booster. The Novavax booster is the same vaccine used for the primary series. Persons who have had COVID-19 should still get a booster to strengthen their immune systems. COVID-19 mRNA boosters that target Omicron are available for Alameda County residents 12+ at the Weekes Community Center Point of Distribution (POD). Updated COVID-19 boosters for children 5-11 will be available the first week of November. Walk-ins are welcome, but appointments are encouraged. Appointments can be made <u>online</u> or by calling the community support line at (510) 268-2101.

### Celebrate Día de los Muertos (The Day of the Dead)

Día de los Muertos is a Mesoamerican holiday celebrated on November 1 and 2 that honors and welcomes back the souls of deceased loved ones. Check

- <u>The REACH Ashland Youth Center</u> 10th Annual Día de Los Muertos Community Celebration, on Wednesday, November 2 at REACH Ashland Youth Center, 16335 E-14th Street in San Leandro, 3:30 p.m. - 6:30 p.m.
- <u>Alameda County Behavioral Health Care Services</u> (ACBH) and <u>Public Health Department</u> (PHD) will



host two booths at the <u>Oakland Día de los Muertos Festival</u>, on Sunday, October 30 on International Blvd. between Fruitvale Ave. and 42<sup>nd</sup> Ave. in Oakland, 10:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. PHD and ACBH will be on-site to distribute COVID-19 kits as well as provide other COVID-19, diabetes, and mental health resources.

### **Mosquito Warning**

This mosquito is of special concern because it has the potential to transmit a variety of diseases and thrives in areas close to humans. Lunches were packed and served by over 20 staff from Nutrition Services, Office of Dental Health, Getting the Most Out of Life – Care Partners, Older Adults Healthy Results, and Healthy Nail Salon programs to approximately 2,000 older adults, exhibitors, and volunteers.

The wide smiles and chatty conversations were a sign that seniors were excited to connect with us and each other in person again!

Activities at the event include community resources for older adults and a photo booth hosted by Getting the Most Out of Life, Older Adults Healthy Results, and Nutrition Services programs. ACPHD's COVID-19 Division pitched in by making COVID testing and COVID and Flu vaccination available.
