### **Increasing Access for those with** Lower Mobility (65+, Conditions)

#### Homebound and low-mobility residents

- RFP to fund mobile vaccinations including popup clinics, home visits-- due April 15
- Vaccine notification form collects info about mobility needs: <u>https://covid-19.acgov.org/vaccines</u>
  - 128 people requesting in-home vaccinations have signed up + 60 from CBOs
  - Public Health Nurses + City Fire Depts will begin vaccinations week of April 12
- Outreach via Meals on Wheels providers, CBOs, FBOS

#### Paratransit access to fixed location PODs

- LAVTA will provide single ride for drive-through • vaccination sites at the Fairgrounds, for residents in the **Tri-Valley Area**
- East Bay Paratransit has not agreed to single rides
- Paratransit information in multiple languages available at covid-19.acgov.org/vaccines#paratransit







### **Pop-up vaccination clinics**

- All residents and staff of Long-Term Care Facilities and all Senior Housing locations have been offered the vaccine through pharmacy partnerships **51,064** doses

  - ~938,000 total doses delivered in Alameda County
