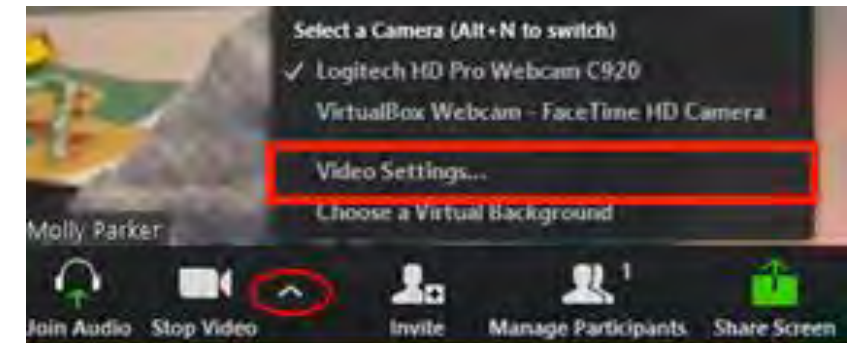
Using Closed Captioning

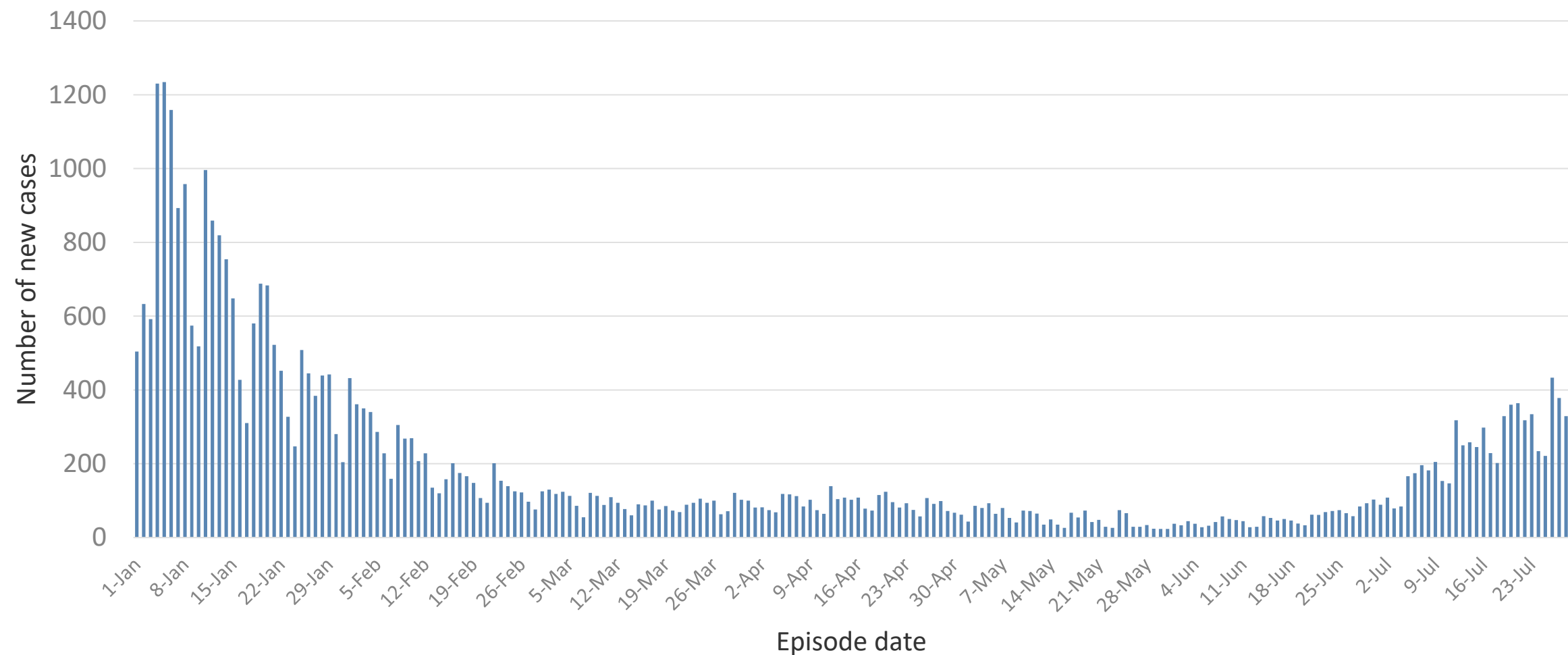

Epidemic Data Key Points

- Daily case rate is **20.3** per 100,000
 - Averaging 300 reported cases per day
- Daily case rate **3 times higher in unvaccinated** compared with *vaccinated* residents
- **Test positivity** is **5.9 %**
 - HPI first quartile: 8.9 %
- **Hospitalized** COVID cases 201 (212 max); ICU 49
- **Testing** ~7,500 per day
- Self-reported **mask use increased** from **65%** on 7/11 to **83%** on 8/8*

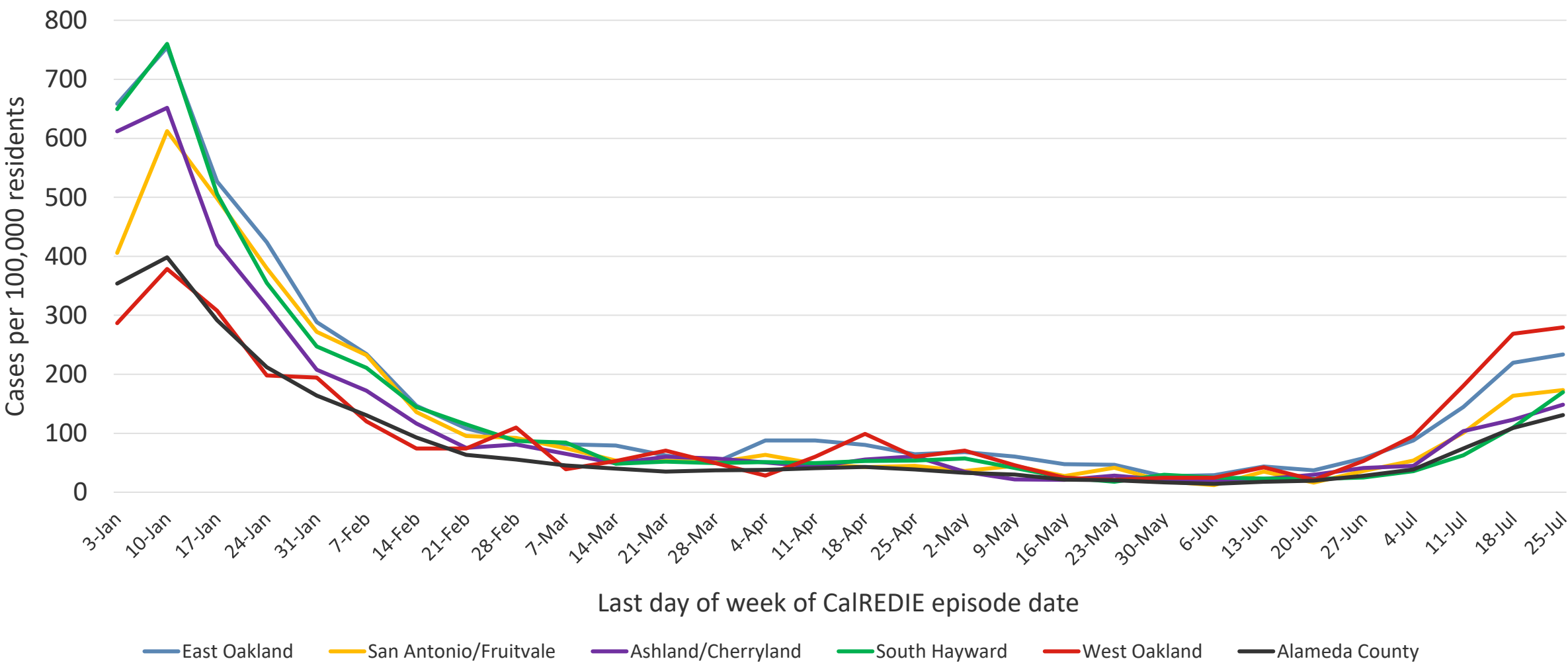
New Alameda County COVID-19 Cases by Episode Date

Face Coverings Required Again for ALL Persons

- Alameda County, City of Berkeley, and 7 other Bay Area counties **requiring face coverings** in **indoor** public settings, regardless of vaccination status
 - Masks may be removed for eating, drinking
 - Other exemptions apply
- **Also recommended:**
 - Businesses should make face coverings available to customers
 - Wear masks in private indoor gatherings if different households are mixing
- **CDC, CDPH** now recommend masks for vaccinated in indoor public settings



Two New State Health Officer Orders Issued August 5



The [first order](#) requires **workers** in health care settings to be **fully vaccinated** or receive their second dose by September 30, 2021.



The [second public health order](#) directs hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, and intermediate care facilities to verify that **visitors** are **fully vaccinated** or have **tested negative** for COVID-19 in the prior 72 hours before indoor visits, effective August 11, 2021.

Testing Demand Continues to Increase

Community Testing Sites Countywide report 3-5 times the testing demand as 2 weeks ago, with percent positives rising in our priority neighborhoods.

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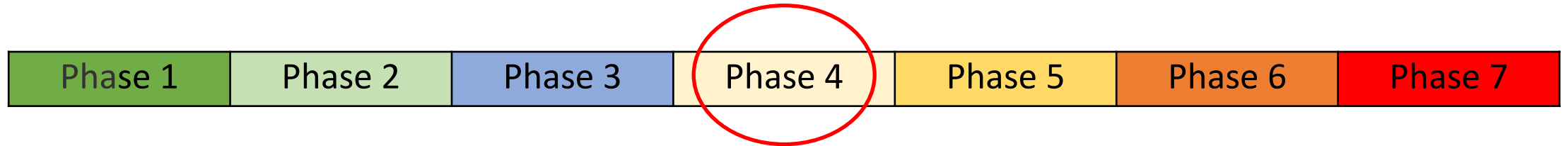
Contingencies

- Testing Division is working with testing sites and state resources to **monitor** testing demand and capacity
- Current eligible **options** if demand surpasses testing capacity:
 - Redeploy current **mobile testing** options to other locations
 - Utilize State Optum Serve **testing buses** at different locations
 - Request **greater resources** from the State
 - Other options under consideration

Case Investigation/Contact Tracing Current Phase & Prioritization

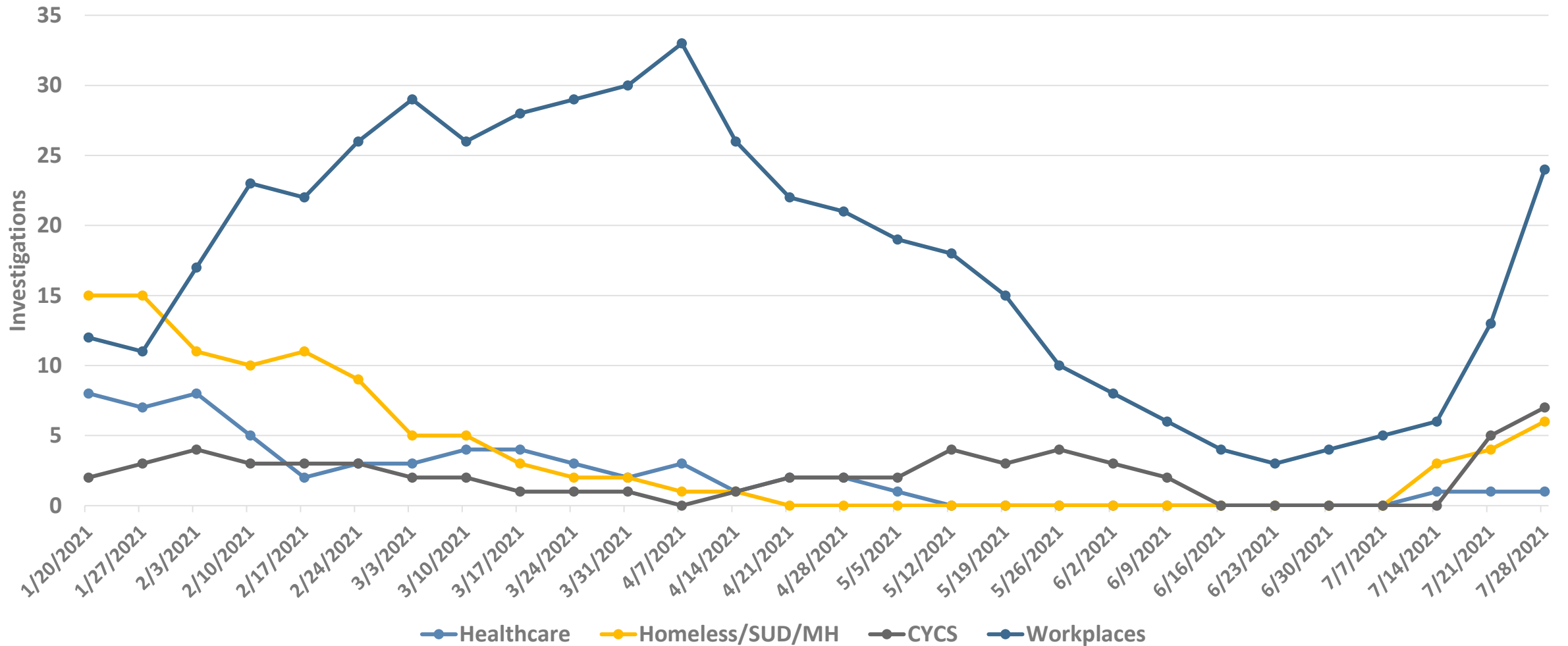


Cal Connect Queue on 8/2/2021, 8:00 AM:

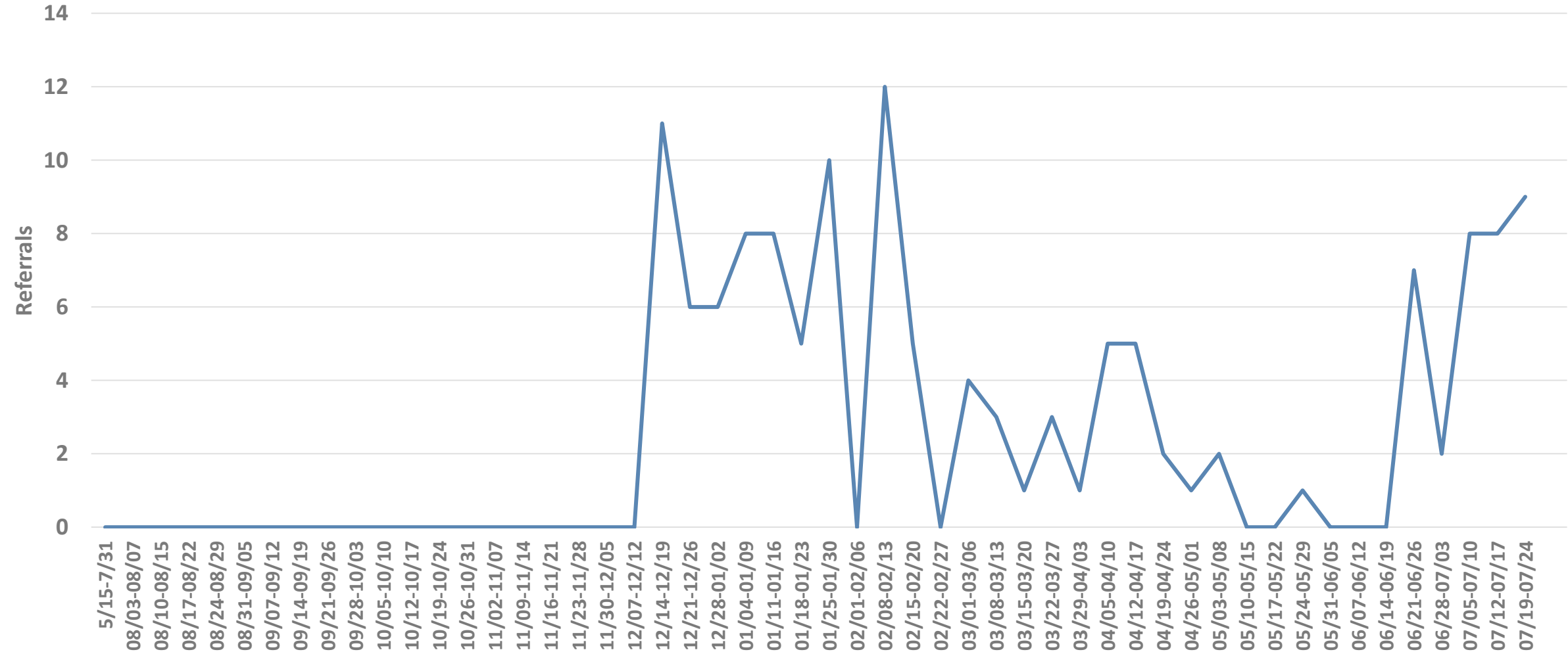
- 987 cases with phone numbers
 - 326 cases in Phase 4 Queue
- 221 SPOT cases and contacts
 - a priority since connected to possible or confirmed outbreak
- 402 contacts
 - now higher priority than last summer since Delta is predominant



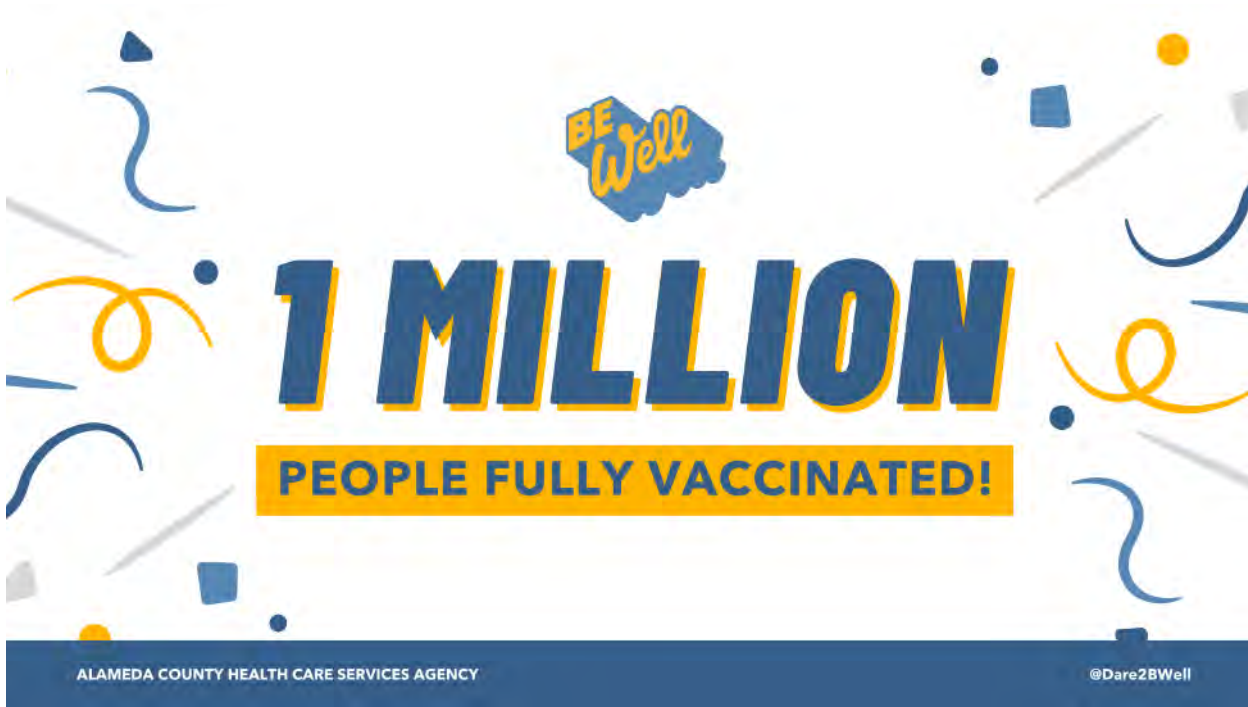

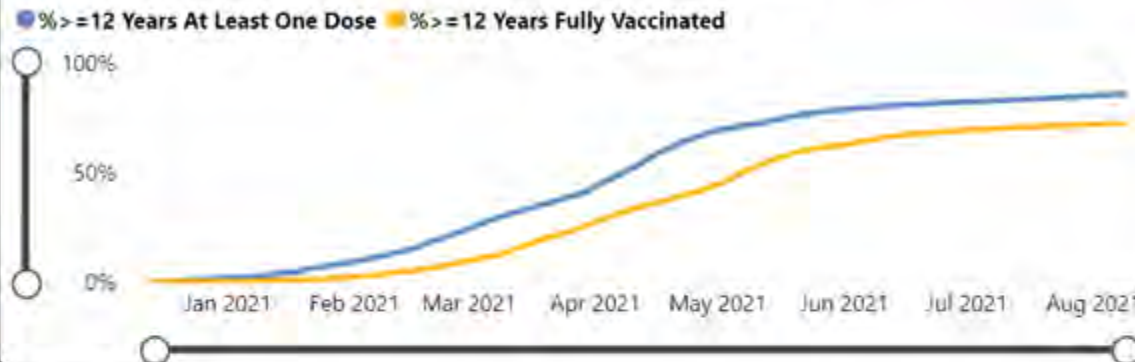

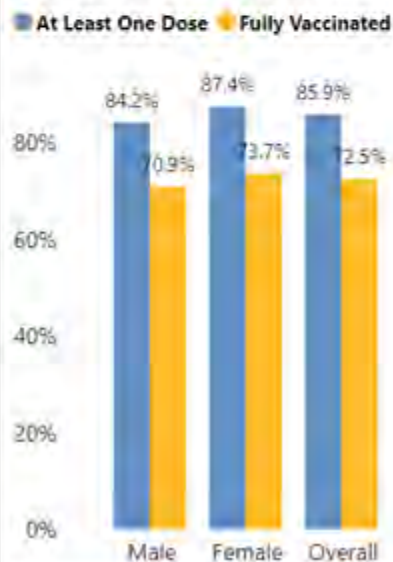

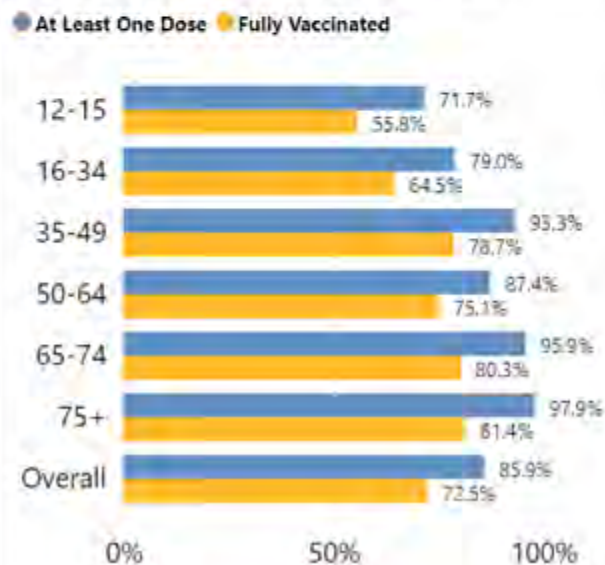
Alameda County Cumulative Percentage of Vaccine Doses



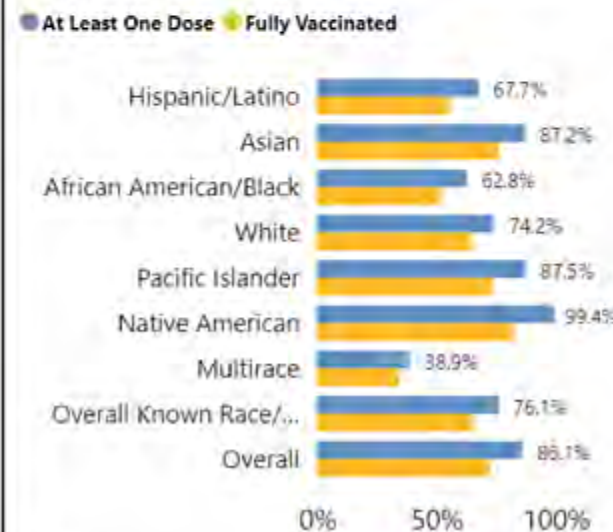
Doses by Gender (% of population >=12 years)

Doses by Race/Ethnicity (% of population >=12 Years)

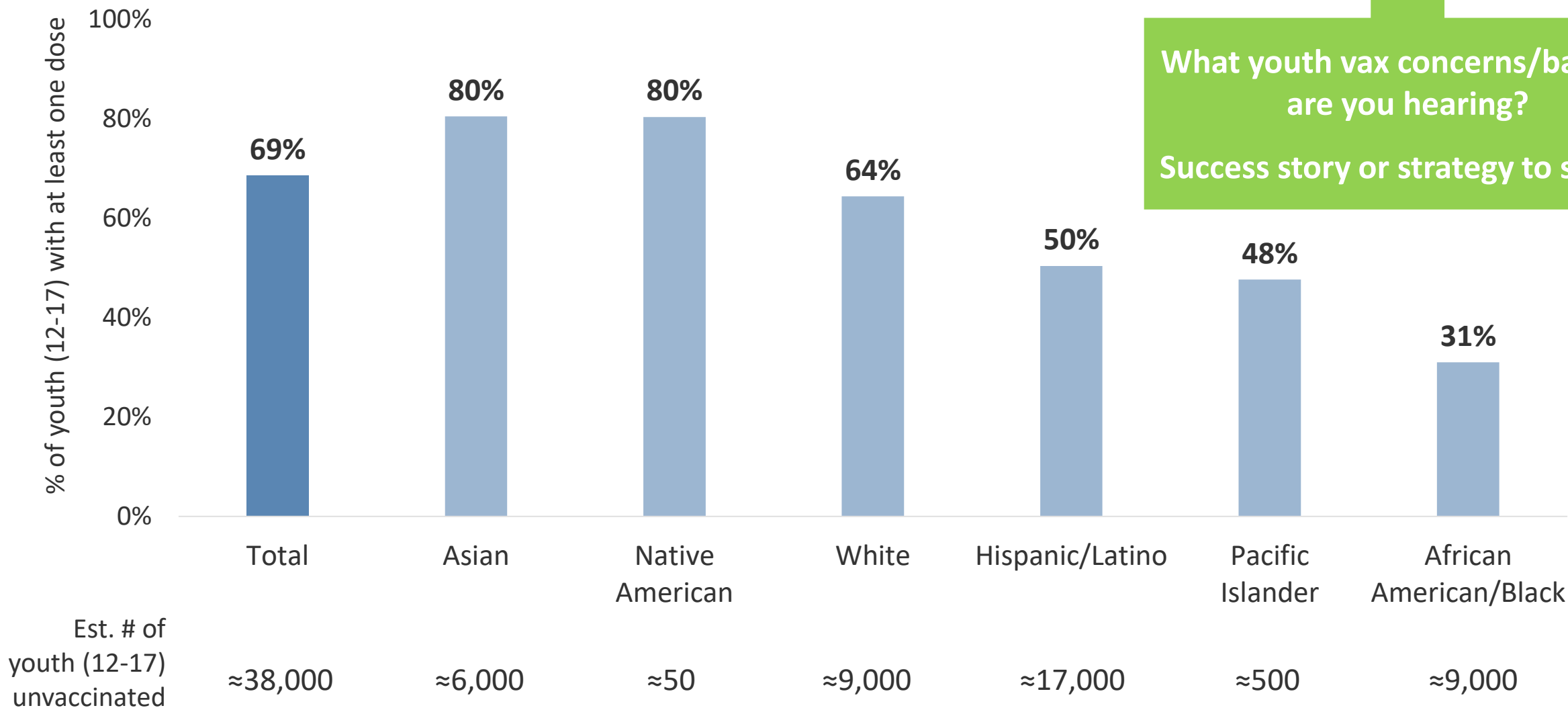

Percentage with at Least One Dose, Overall & by Race/Ethnicity



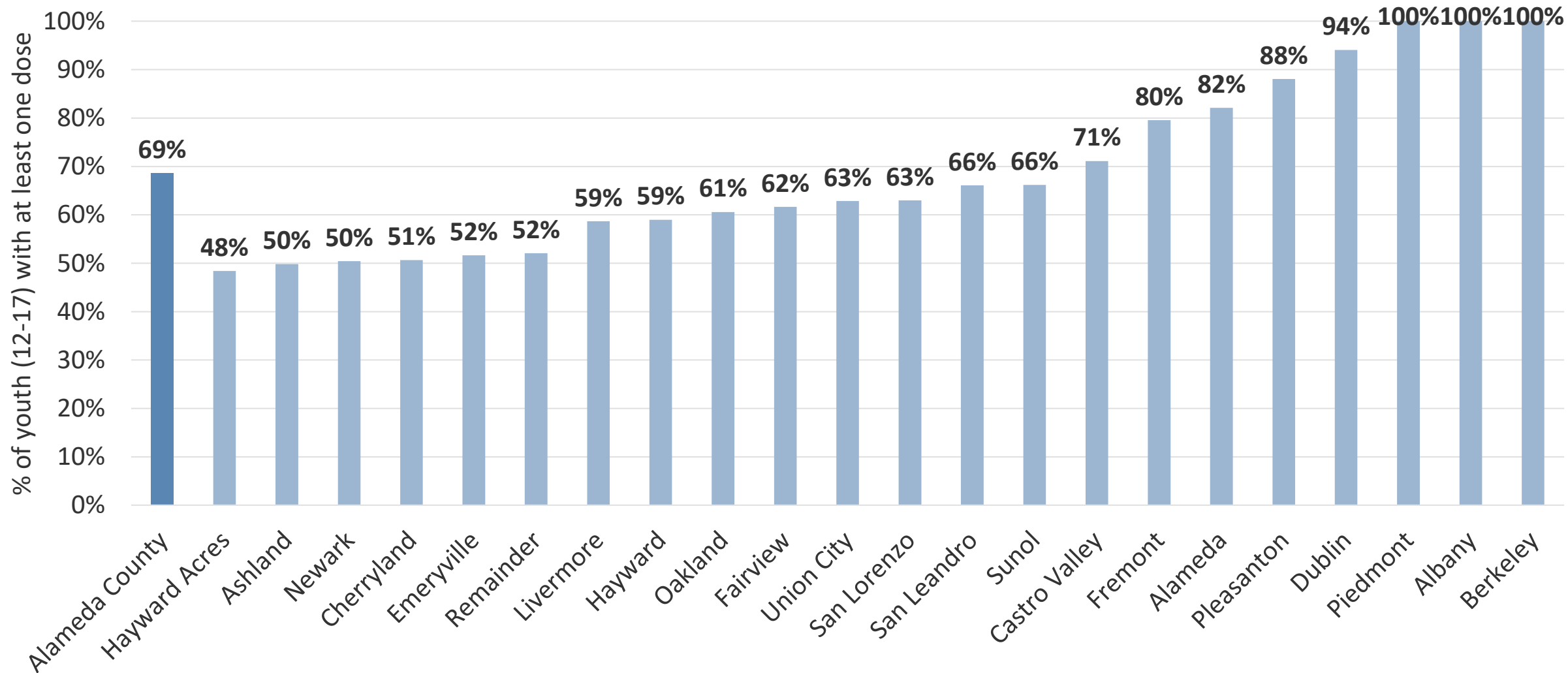

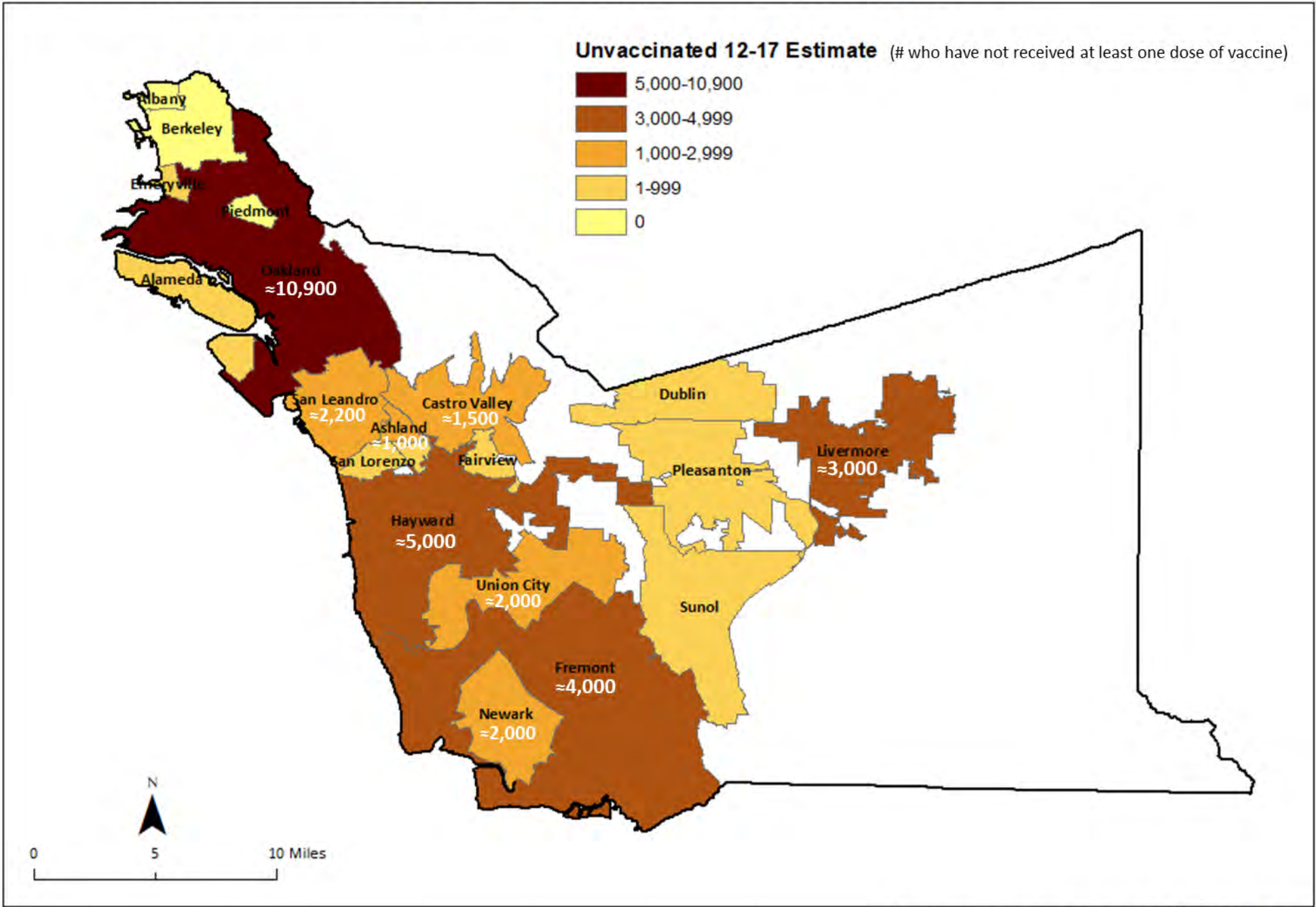


Youth (12-17) Vaccination Rates by City/Place:

Percentage with at Least One Dose

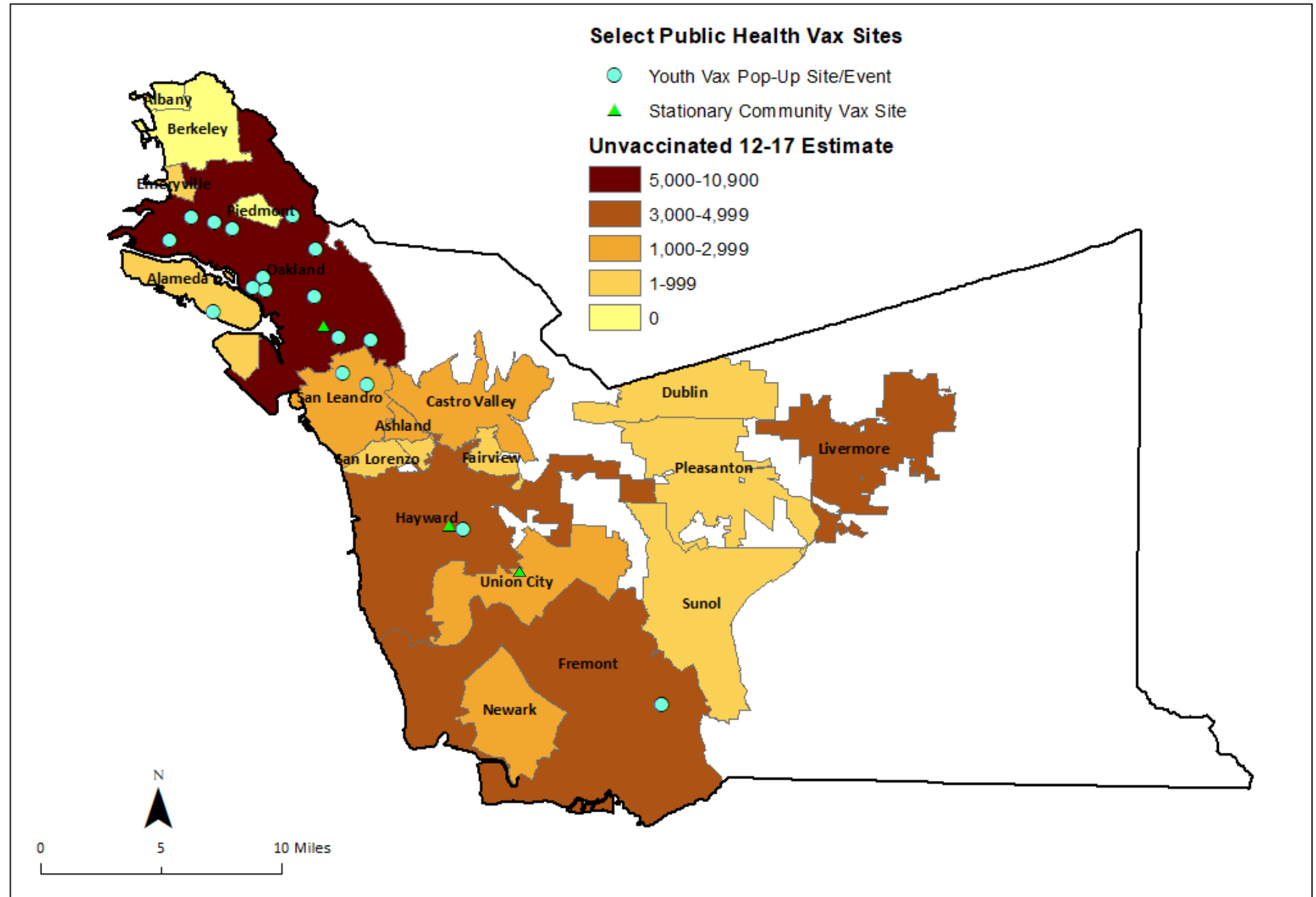


Unvaccinated Youth (12-17) Estimates by City/Place

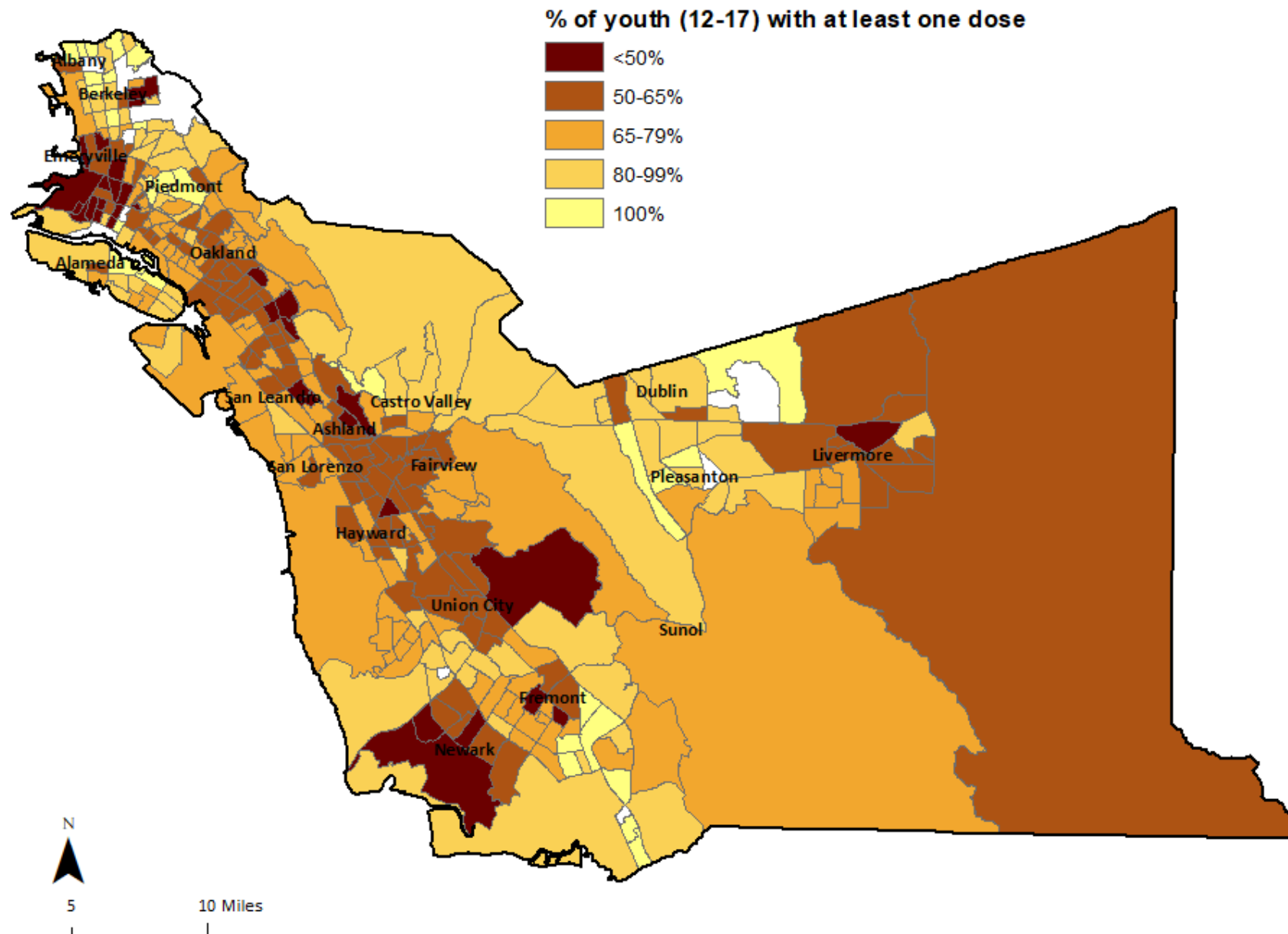

Seven Layers to Keep Kids and Schools Safe



COVID-19 Vaccine: The best protection against COVID-19



Masks: Required indoors and strongly recommended outdoors



Ventilation: Good airflow in classrooms and school buildings



Regular hand washing!

Seven Layers to Keep Kids and Schools Safe



Stay home when sick!



Testing: COVID-19 testing can detect the virus even before students or teachers start to feel sick



Contact Tracing: Schools will track close contacts with someone on campus who tested positive for COVID-19 and will notify staff and students who have been exposed



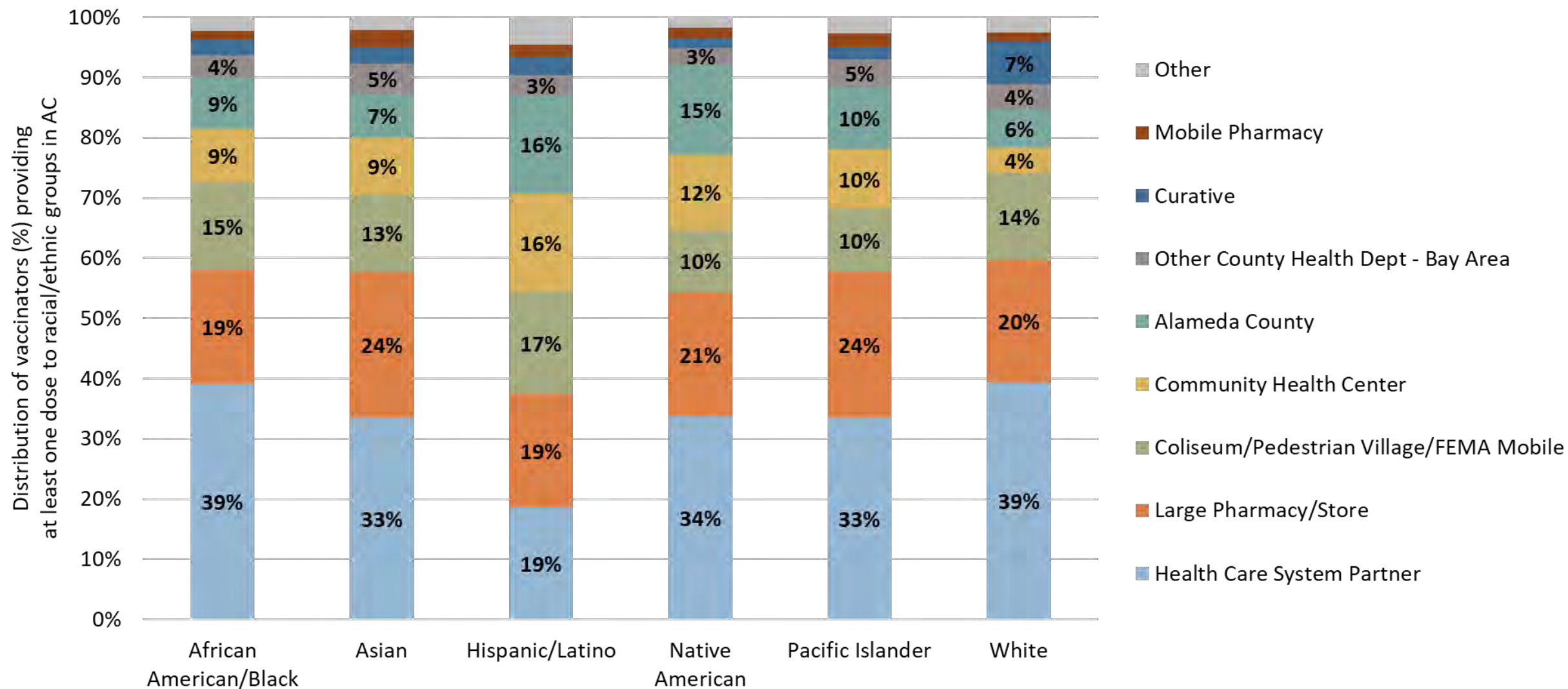
Independent Study 2021-22

- The California Legislature passed Senate Bill (**SB 130**), directing districts across the state to offer independent study as an educational option for 2021-22 for families who opt **NOT** to have their children return to full in-person instruction in public K-12 schools.
- The state did not provide a pathway for districts to offer hybrid education this year.
- Districts are mandated to either offer in-person instruction or independent study.

3.3 Direct Outreach to Our Residents (D.O.O.R.) Program

Mike Rubio



D.O.O.R. Program

- Launched on July 17 as collaboration with the **Alameda County Public Health Department, Kaiser Permanente**, and neighborhood-based **community organizations**
- Jointly funded by our Health Care Services Agency and the Kaiser Community Benefits program
- Door-to-door outreach across **23 census tracts** with the lowest vaccination rates and highest number of unvaccinated **African-American/Black** and **Latino/a/x residents**
- Includes 9 small organizations that have been participating in the **Community Navigators** program connected to our vaccine PODs
- Some **Outreach and Health Education (OHE)** providers have incorporated DOOR into their existing contracts

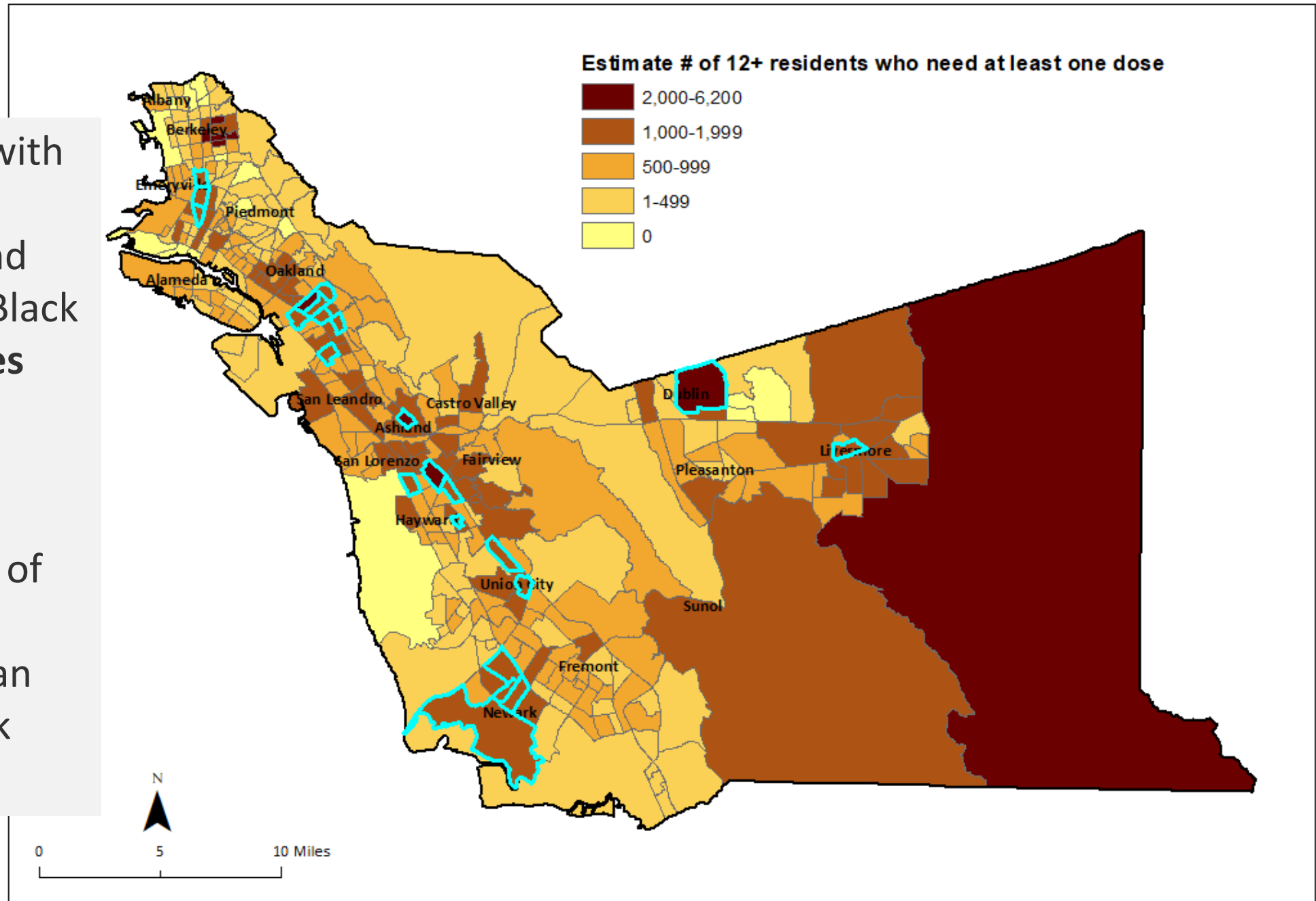

D.O.O.R. Program

- Moving at the speed of trust
- Goal of **90,000 conversations** in 8 weeks
- In addition to one-on-one support, we hold alternating bi-weekly **DOOR Coordination and Learning Circle** meetings, plus weekly newsletters with updated resources
- **Door-knocking** is 1 of 4 modalities we're utilizing during this time
- Other forms of outreach include **pop-up events**, canvassing **commercial corridor**, and **mobile clinics**

D.O.O.R. Program

- Outreach kits prepared every 2 weeks and as needed
- All materials are translated into Spanish and other languages upon request

- Community resources are separated by region for ease of navigation – Oakland, San Leandro/ Hayward, Tri-Valley, Tri-City
- Other resources: testing sites, rental relief, Alameda County resources 1-pager
- As of 8/6 we have:
 - 387 views
 - 345 clicks
 - 89.5 click through rate
