




Epidemic Data Key Points

- Daily case rate is **20.3** per 100,000
 - Averaging 300 reported cases per day
- Daily case rate 3 times higher in unvaccinated compared with vaccinated residents
- Test positivity is 5.9 %
 - HPI first quartile: 8.9 %
- Hospitalized COVID cases 201 (212 max); ICU 49
- Testing ~7,500 per day
- Self-reported mask use increased from 65% on 7/11 to 83% on 8/8*


New Alameda County COVID-19 Cases by Episode Date

Alameda County COVID-19 Weekly Case Rates





Face Coverings Required Again for ALL Persons

- Alameda County, City of Berkeley, and 7 other Bay Area counties requiring face coverings in indoor public settings, regardless of vaccination status
 - Masks may be removed for eating, drinking
 - Other exemptions apply
- Also recommended:
 - Businesses should make face coverings available to customers
 - Wear masks in private indoor gatherings if different households are mixing
- CDC, CDPH now recommend masks for vaccinated in indoor public settings





Two New State Health Officer Orders Issued August 5



The <u>first order</u> requires **workers** in health care settings to be **fully vaccinated** or receive their second dose by September 30, 2021.



The <u>second public health order</u> directs hospitals, skilled nursing facilities, and intermediate care facilities to verify that **visitors** are **fully vaccinated** *or* have **tested negative** for COVID-19 in the prior 72 hours before indoor visits, effective August 11, 2021.

Testing Demand Continues to Increase

Community Testing Sites Countywide report 3-5 times the testing demand as 2 weeks ago, with percent positives rising in our priority neighborhoods.





Contingencies

- Testing Division is working with testing sites and state resources to monitor testing demand and capacity
- Current eligible options if demand surpasses testing capacity:
 - Redeploy current mobile testing options to other locations
 - Utilize State Optum Serve testing buses at different locations
 - Request greater resources from the State
 - Other options under consideration




Cal Connect Queue on 8/2/2021, 8:00 AM:




Percentage with at Least One Dose, Overall & by Race/Ethnicity






Youth (12-17) Vaccination Rates by City/Place:

Percentage with at Least One Dose




Unvaccinated Youth (12-17) Estimates by City/Place



COVID-19 Vaccine: The best protection against COVID-19



Masks: Required indoors and strongly recommended outdoors



Ventilation: Good airflow in classrooms and school buildings

Independent Study 2021-22


- The California Legislature passed Senate Bill (SB 130), directing districts across the state to offer independent study as an educational option for 2021-22 for families who opt *NOT* to have their children return to full in-person instruction in public K-12 schools.
- The state did not provide a pathway for districts to offer hybrid education this year.
- Districts are mandated to either offer inperson instruction or independent study.


Vaccinators who have provided at least one dose, by ethnic/racial group

3.3 Direct Outreach to Our Residents (D.O.O.R.) Program

Mike Rubio



- Launched on July 17 as collaboration with the Alameda County Public Health Department, Kaiser Permanente, and neighborhood-based community organizations
- Jointly funded by our Health Care Services Agency and the Kaiser Community Benefits program
- Door-to-door outreach across 23 census tracts with the lowest vaccination rates and highest number of unvaccinated African-American/Black and Latino/a/x residents
- Includes 9 small organizations that have been participating in the
 Community Navigators program connected to our vaccine PODs
- Some Outreach and Health Education (OHE) providers have incorporated DOOR into their existing contracts



- Moving at the speed of trust
- Goal of **90,000 conversations** in 8 weeks
- In addition to one-on-one support, we hold alternating bi-weekly DOOR Coordination and Learning Circle meetings, plus weekly newsletters with updated resources
- Door-knocking is 1 of 4 modalities we're utilizing during this time
- Other forms of outreach include popup events, canvassing commercial corridor, and mobile clinics



Serenity House Mobile Vaccination Clinic

- Outreach kits prepared every 2 weeks and as needed
- All materials are translated into Spanish and other languages upon request


